

Making a Donation to George House Trust



George House Trust is the HIV voluntary organisation for the North West of England. We are supporting over 950 people living with and affected by HIV in the region.

One of our most valued areas of work is our Welfare Fund. This provides emergency and hardship payments to people with HIV in financial need. This can be to help with household bills, clothing needs or essential items. Increasingly it is being used for very basic needs, such as food, for people who are the victims of benefit delays or cutbacks, or because, as asylum seekers, people are not entitled to benefits. In 2001 over £80,000 was paid directly to people with HIV through the George House Trust Welfare Fund.

Although we receive grants and donations for much of our work, nobody provides money towards our Welfare Fund. We rely entirely on the generosity of individuals to enable the fund to continue.
